BioPrime Hosts Balanced Fertilization Training Workshop

"Balanced fertilization rice farming methods and practices" is the theme of the technical workshop sponsored by BioPrime Agri Industries, Inc. in Barangay San Miguel, Quezon Nueva Ecija, April 8, 2022 (Friday).

This workshop will be in technical collaboration with the Department of Agriculture following Secretary William Dar's mandate to scale up the use of biotechnologies to modernize Philippine agriculture. Balanced fertilization is the use of conventional synthetic fertilizers together with other fertilization techniques such as nano or biological fertilizers. This approach has been shown to increase yields, improve soil health and reduce chemical use, and most importantly to improve farmer earnings. With synthetic fertilizer costs up almost 300% in recent times, balanced fertilization presents a solution for farmers to both save money and increase yields.

BioPrime is a leading Nano fertilizer in the Philippines that has been proven under repeated independent trials with PhilRice to increase yield whilst reducing farm input costs in rice farming. Similar promise has been demonstrated with corn and sugar cane, with trials continuing.
